Riviera Beach, Fla.– The Port of Palm Beach District announces that longtime Port Commissioner Dr. Jean Landfair Enright, has submitted her letter of resignation, which is effective on Friday, October 24, 2025. Dr. Enright resigned for personal reasons.

Port Commission Chair Blair Ciklin stated, “During Dr. Enright’s two decades of service on the Port Commission, she has been a steadfast advocate for community engagement, education, and economic development. Her leadership and commitment have contributed to the Port’s continued growth and its role as an economic engine for Palm Beach County.”

The Port Commissioner Group 3 seat will remain vacant until the remaining commissioners appoint a new member or filled during the next election cycle.
